Murrayview Field Day and Presentation - Monday 18th June

The Central Murray BestWool / BestLamb Group (CMBW/BL) is having a field day at "Murrayview" hosted by Simon Ettershank to demonstrate the germination success and growth of different varieties of forage crop species planted on the 4th April. The day starts at 10am and finishes at 2pm.

The field day will outline the method for determining dry matter quantities from the seven varieties sown. For participants that attended the CMBW/BL

By opening up local farms we offer other farmers and urban people the chance to share knowledge. We ask people to come and see how real farms work and to see all the great things that farmers are doing to improve and care for their farms, employing best management practices.

What is the aim?

- To connect urban and rural people.
- Rebuild the profile of

real farming and agriculture.

- To break down barriers and stereotypes.
- To show urban people that agriculture and the environment are interconnected and illustrate the beneficial environmental works being done on farm.
- To show the connection farmers have to aboriginal heritage.
- Offer other farmers the chance to see what other people are doing, knowledge sharing so that it is informative for farmers as well as city people.
- Big focus on how much farmers love their farms.
- Since the local region has a wide diversity of agriculture, from intensive irrigation systems used for horticulture, dairy, cropping

etc. to rangeland livestock operations, it is an ideal place to showcase agriculture.

- May lead to future tourism / educational opportunities for the area.

MCMA Funding Approved for Moulamein Central Primary School

The Moulamein Central Primary School have been successful in obtaining a grant to create a native food garden. The grant of \$2000 is provided by the Murray Catchment Management Authority (MCMA) under the 2012 Community Grants Program.

The objective of the project is to grow an indigenous food garden which will educate the public on Aboriginal culture and help preserve knowledge of how local native plants were prepared and treated for food, fibre and medicine.

It is anticipated that people from the Moulamein School, local indigenous groups, the MCMA and Western Murray Land Improvement Group will be involved in the project. General members of the community and community groups will also be encouraged to participate in the project.

The Western Murray Land Improvement Group is a co-contributor of funding and will assist with project management and labour in collaboration with other community groups.

Funding Opportunities

Thinking about purchasing conservation tillage equipment?

The Australian Government will provide a 15% refundable tax offset for eligible conservation tillage equipment installed between 1 July 2012 and 30 June 2015, through the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry. Exact details are yet to be released.

Private Land Conservation Grants

The grants program aims to support private landholders with Conservation Agreements to undertake conservation works on their property. Grants of up to \$3000 are available.

Private Land Conservation Grants are only available to owners of covenanted properties in NSW to conduct habitat or species conservation projects on their property.

Nuffield Australia Farming Scholarships open

Applications are now open for the 2013 Nuffield Australia Farming Scholarships. These prestigious scholarships are awarded each year to Australian farmers, with the objective of increasing practical farming knowledge and management skills and techniques generally.

The scholarships give Australian citizens the opportunity to study farming practices in New Zealand, Europe, Asia and the Americas and those countries best suited to each scholar. They also promote a closer understanding between farmers in the countries visited.

Upon returning to Australia it is expected that scholars will be able to actively spread the knowledge and understanding they have gained among their fellow farmers and others.
